Introduction and Welcome

- Creation of NYC-CUNY CDC Prevention Center with focus on prevention and management of chronic diseases in Asian and Hispanic New Yorkers, 2014
- Sponsorship of two citywide forums in Advancing Health Equity in New York City, 2014
- Establishment of CUNY SPH Center on Global and Immigrant Health, 2015

Dean El-Mohandes also referenced a recent article [Keeping the "public" in schools of public health](#), authored by Freudenberg N, Klitzman S, Diamond C, El-Mohandes A., Am J Public Health. 2015 Mar;105 Suppl 1:S119-24. doi: 10.2105/AJPH.2014.302534. This article compared the role of public and private academic institutions of public health, looking at the diversity of the student body, the role of public funding and the important contributions of public institutions to the future of public health.

Abstract

In this article, we compared the characteristics of public and private accredited public health training programs. We analyzed the distinct opportunities and challenges that publicly funded schools of public health face in preparing the nation's public health workforce. Using our experience in creating a new, collaborative public school of public health in the nation's largest urban public university system, we described efforts to use our public status and mission to develop new approaches to educating a workforce that meets the health needs of our region and contributes to the goal of reducing health inequalities. Finally, we considered policies that could protect and strengthen the distinct contributions that public schools of public health make to improving population health and reducing health inequalities.

Strategic Plan Presentation & Discussion

Dean El-Mohandes reports that Dr. Mary Basett and Dr. Oxiris Barbot, of the NYC Department of Health and Mental Hygiene are creating with new initiatives to address social and health equity, and that the

School of Public Health is committed to partnering with them, and training our students to be the next generation of public health leaders. Dean El-Mohandes stressed that the school must entertain the

uniqueness of public health as a domain of learning and prepare the workforce in domains that are essential to moving public health in the future.

The school undertook to redesign the vision and mission statements.

- Vision Statement:

“Promoting health and social justice in NYC and across the globe through innovation and leadership”

- Mission Statement:

“The mission of the CUNY SPH is to provide a collaborative and accessible environment for education, research, and service in public health, to promote and sustain healthier populations in NYC and around the world, and to shape policy and practice in public health for all”.

Applied Policy in Public Health

There are challenges in how students are prepared to contribute, respond, influence, interpret and implement the great advances that are being made locally, nationally and globally in public health policy. Methods of learning should be revamped, new relationships with community partners established, and social networking improve. CUNY SPH intends on placing a lot of time and effort in this area in order to produce a workforce that is going to fill the real challenges of public health for the future.

Dr. Bassett commended the CUNY School of Public Health for embracing policy as an important domain of public health practice. She stressed the importance of the school building on urban public health and embracing the notion for structural change. She also encouraged the school to continue its intentional development of a diverse cadres of public health leaders who reflect the diversity of NYC and reiterated her commitment to diversity in leadership at the NYCDOH.

“Strategic Pillars”- Population Health

Dr. Basset and Dr. Cohen lead a provocative discussion of population health, sharing their perspectives, and suggesting what the term population health might mean to CUNY SPH as the school moves forward.

Mary Bassett

Population Health means talking about the health of the population as it lives in the neighborhood of the city and not only the population of people who seek health care. A big challenge to bridge the gap between public health and primary care is that in the healthcare delivery sector, in terms of individual services, health care providers tend to see the population as their patients panel. This is not the way to find out how people are doing in their neighborhoods. Everyday life is what contributes to a person’s health, not adherence to medical advice.

New York City Department of Mental Health mainly describes the health of the population of NYC through The Community Health Survey. Introduced a decade ago, the survey collects information to give neighborhood estimates. It is a tool that enables the Department to make statements about the health of the city. The city is residentially segregated and bringing in the community voice is important to population health. Communities need to strategize in how to improve the health of the community. The Department does not have the agility to how communities can view their own health. The CUNY School of Public Health can make a “shift in tone”, and work towards implementing a solution.

There is potentially a real changing workforce opportunity in the changes in healthcare. There is a difference between the healthcare sector and public health. One major difference is that healthcare is highly resourced and there is an opportunity with health care, to focus on what happens to people outside of clinical settings. There is an incomplete step in health care and that is *how* to serve patients. There is a real growing potential workforce in community health workers, care managers, navigators, care coordinators, coaches, and outreach workers. People with some public health training could fit in very well. Another way that health care is changing is that outcomes are being measured. A role that CUNY School of Public Health could play is to try and bridge data that public health has used with the data that clinicians have used.

Both Bassett and Cohen offered thoughts about the importance of systems approaches to population health

There is an ongoing effort to applying systems thinking in addressing frameworks. Some examples of systems a work:

- Through coursework, doctoral students are getting hands on training
- Conceptualize space and how space can promote better health [focus on schools and hospital builders]
- Cross sectoral approaches [how can we create new incentives to spur innovation into a more helpful impact]
- Experiment with social entrepreneurial models

Questions and Comments from Advisory Council Members

In terms of strategizing and moving forward, CUNY School of Public Health should educate students to not only meet the challenges of the changing public health landscape, but to influence and change public health policy. Such students would be able to “infiltrate” government, non-profit and private organizations to shape the direction of public health. “Population Health is being co-opted by the health care delivery system”. This is an important opportunity to redefine this term (Oxiris Barbot).

Given the significant increase in the number of SPH applicant, does the School have any feel for the quality of applicants (Max Gomez)?

Quality at the CUNY School of Public Health is great, it is the harvest that is in question because for the first time, applicants belong to a national pool rather than applicants that are discreetly applying to the CUNY SPH. In the past, the acceptance matriculation rate was about 1-2. For every two acceptances, 1 student came to the School of Public Health and if not, they went to Columbia or NYU. This year, students are applying locally, nationally and globally. Recruiting students all across the country profoundly changes the dynamic of students who would not go on to live and work in New York City.

85% of CUNY students *globally* go on to live and work in New York City. We take pride in the fact that CUNY students are a critical workforce for all aspects of NYC life.

In the past year, the New York City Department of Health and Mental Hygiene has hired 82 of CUNY SPH undergraduate, masters, and doctoral students, as summer interns.

Is the CUNY School of Public Health looking at the diversity of race in students and faculty? As a pipeline to positions in the Department of Health, there needs to be a diverse population (Mary Bassett).

There is an ongoing effort to recruit, enroll and retain a mix of students that the school feels is needed in the public health workforce in New York City. CUNY as a whole has been challenged as its improved academic quality to maintain enrollment particularly of black and latino men. This is a university wide issue that is being worked on. The CUNY SPH does considerably better in all schools of public health and even in all public schools of public health in the proportion of black and latino students that are enrolled. The School of Public Health also has the advantage of having as a recruiting ground the 15 plus undergraduate programs that prepare students in public health related fields and that cohort of undergraduate students is much more diverse than the national pool. Liaison programs are also being developed with existing and several new undergraduate public health programs throughout the CUNY system. These programs are an important entry path for New Yorkers, blacks, latinos, and immigrants, to come into training programs being offered. Ongoing partnerships are important. Retention and where CUNY SPH students go after graduation is just as significant.

Is there some intentionality in what the school is training its students to do? Do our students have a specific desire to work in public health (Pat Wang)?

The CUNY SPH Career Fair held on February 23 was a success. Evaluation questions were asked in a survey provided to the organizations that attended. Another survey is currently being worked on that will help in identifying core skills that employers are looking for.

Other Key Questions & Comments:

The Office of the Bronx District Attorney is always present at Health Fairs. How does public health effect public safety, low income areas, and high crime areas. How can low income areas focus on good health when high crime is a major issue (Barbara Robles-Gonzalez)?

How can the school create partnerships with hospitals? Which institutions do we want to change and where do we want our students to go? Can the school offer certificates in Primary Care (Oxiris Barbot)?

It is important that CUNY School of Public Health help students understand the economics of where they live and to also assist them in trying to shape their communities. Students should have a framework to where they are headed (Pat Wang).

Expose all CUNY students to public health. They should be seen as “forced multipliers” and can play a huge role in the success of the school’s mission (Max Gomez).

CUNY has an alumni council for the entire University and recommends that CUNY School of Public Health participate (Duffie Cohen)

Offer a password protected alumni network so that alumni can have open and confidential discussions (Fred Rich)

Advisory Council members have to get to know the CUNY School of Public Health and should be invited to all events (Andrea Davis Cohen)

Max Gomez kindly agreed to assist with CUNY’s new public health communications and media programs.

Establish a successful development campaign

Council members were asked if there was willingness for them to help the CUNY School of Public Health raise funds. Fred Rich commented:

- Friend raising has to proceed fundraising (CUNY School of Public Health is a new school and does not have a track record)
- Think about how the school will introduce itself – do not just ask for money
- CUNY SPH has impressive intellectuals – put out intellectual content
- Have a charismatic leader – Dean El-Mohandes
- Put topical health issue as insider view
- What is the CUNY SPH elevator speech? It has to be authentic

Suggestions/Comments to Advisory Council Members

- Engage with the CUNY School of Public Health in the learning process of theoretical framework
- Design thinking strategies: where do people access healthy foods and how do we build healthy neighborhoods?
- Find the domain where *you* want to be engaged
- How can *you* bring other voices to us?
- Reach out to other big cities to do comparison work – think more outside the box

Lyndon Haviland asked that Council members assist with pointing the CUNY School of Public Health in the right direction. What language should be used to assist with fundraising and are there any communities that the school is overlooking.

Dean El-Mohandes reiterated how thankful he is to Fred Rich, staff at Sullivan & Cromwell, Advisory Council members, CUNY SPH Deans, faculty, staff, and students.
