

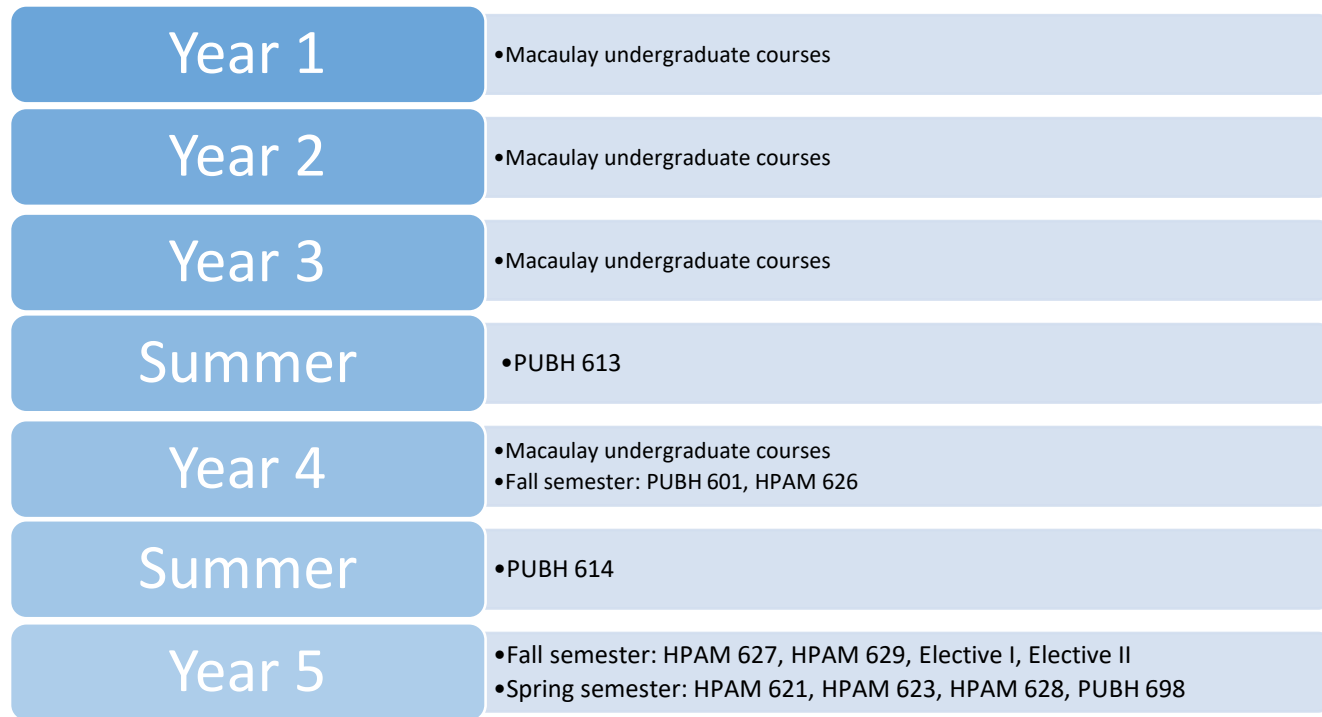
**Department of Health Policy and Management**  
**Master of Science (MS) degree in Global and Migrant Health Policy for Macaulay Honors College students**

The Department of Health Policy and Management aims to improve population health by enhancing access to care, increasing efficiencies across health systems, and eliminating disparities. Our faculty approach these aims by providing leadership and expertise in support of healthcare system innovation, conducting analyses of the policies and economic realities underpinning healthcare systems, and engaging in political advocacy. Faculty researchers are accomplished in domains spanning global health care organization and delivery systems, healthy aging across the life span, economics and global health, HIV policy and practice, substance use policy, among others.

The Department offers an MS in Global and Migrant Health Policy that is designed to provide professionals with the content expertise and research methods required to evaluate, develop and design global and migrant health policies. The program’s core curriculum is rooted in public health competencies while its content and context is framed with respect to global health policy development and national, state/provincial and municipal policy effecting migrant populations in urban settings in high-, low-, and middle-income countries. This program is fully online.

Undergraduate students at the Macaulay Honors College, CUNY can complete their BA and MS in Global and Migrant Health Policy degrees in 4+1 years by following the sequence described in figure 1 and completing the MS courses described in table 1.
